SIN AGAINST MAN & SIN AGAINST GOD

The Hebrew word is **2403. chatta’ah**

The Greek word is **266. hamartia**

266. hamartia

Definition: a sin, failure

Usage: prop: missing the mark; hence: (a) guilt, sin, (b) a fault, failure (in an *loss* (forfeiture) because not hitting *the target*; *sin* (missing the mark). ethical sense), sinful deed.

a sinning, whether it occurs **by omission** or **commission**, in **thought and feeling** or in **speech and action**

From the Ten Commandments | Exodus 20

we have false worship, idolatry, misusing God's name, violating the Sabbath, dishonoring parents, murder, adultery, stealing, lying/libel, and coveting

Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 5-7)

Regarding murder, Jesus said, “Anyone who is angry with his brother will be subject to judgment.... But anyone who says, 'You fool!' will be in danger of the fire of hell” ([Matthew 5:22](#)).

Regarding adultery...

Jesus said, “Anyone who looks at a woman lustfully has already committed adultery with her in his heart” ([Matthew 5:28](#)).

In Galatians 5:19-21 we are told, the acts of the sinful nature are obvious:

sexual immorality, impurity and debauchery; idolatry and witchcraft; hatred, discord, jealousy, fits of rage, selfish

impurity

- 1: something that is impure or makes something else impure
- 2: the quality or state of being impure

debauchery

- 1: extreme indulgence in bodily pleasures and especially sexual pleasures : behavior involving sex, drugs, alcohol, etc. that is often considered immoral

idolatry

- 1: the worship of a physical object as a god
- 2: immoderate attachment or devotion to something

witchcraft

- 1a: the use of sorcery or magic
- b: communication with the devil or with a familiar
- 2: an irresistible influence or fascination
- 3a: rituals and practices that incorporate belief in magic and that are associated especially with neo-pagan traditions and religions (such as Wicca)

hatred

1: extreme dislike or disgust : HATE

2: ill will or resentment that is usually mutual : prejudiced hostility or animosity

discord

(Entry 1 of 2)

1a: lack of agreement or harmony (as between persons, things, or ideas)

b: active quarreling or conflict resulting from discord among persons or factions : STRIFE

jealousy

1: a jealous disposition, attitude, or feeling a marriage destroyed

2: zealous vigilance

rage

1a: violent and uncontrolled anger

b: a fit of violent wrath

archaic : INSANITY

2: violent action (as of wind or sea)

3: an intense feeling : PASSION

1: to be in a rage

2: to be in tumult

3: to prevail uncontrollably

selfish

1: concerned excessively or exclusively with oneself : seeking or concentrating on one's own advantage, pleasure, or well-being without regard for others

2: arising from concern with one's own welfare or advantage in disregard of others

ambition

1a: an ardent desire for rank, fame, or power

b: desire to achieve a particular end

dissension

: DISAGREEMENT *especially* : partisan and contentious quarreling

faction

1: a party or group (as within a government) that is often contentious or self-seeking : CLIQUET.

2: party spirit especially when marked by dissension

envies

Definition of *envy*

1: painful or resentful awareness of an advantage enjoyed by another joined with a desire to possess the same advantage

2*obsolete* : MALICE

3: an object of envious notice or feeling

1: to feel envy toward or on account of

2*obsolete* : BEGRUDGE

drunken

1: DRUNK_SENSE 1a *drunken* driver

2*obsolete* : saturated with liquid

3a: given to habitual excessive use of alcohol

b: of, relating to, or characterized by intoxication

c: resulting from or as if from intoxication

orgy

1: secret ceremonial rites held in honor of an ancient Greek or Roman deity and usually characterized by ecstatic singing and dancing

2a: drunken revelry

b: a sexual encounter involving many people *also* : an excessive sexual indulgence

3: excessive indulgence in something especially to satisfy an inordinate appetite or craving

false

1: not genuine

2a: intentionally untrue

transitive verb

1: to honor or show reverence for as a divine being or supernatural power

2: to regard with great or extravagant respect, honor, or devotion

intransitive verb

: to perform or take part in worship or an act of worship

- 1: reverence offered a divine being or supernatural power *also* : an act of expressing such reverence
- 2: a form of religious practice with its creed and ritual
- 3: extravagant respect or admiration for or devotion to an object of esteem

curse

- 1: a prayer or invocation for harm or injury to come upon one : IMPRECATION
- 2: a profane or obscene oath or word
- 3: something that is cursed or accursed
- 4: evil or misfortune that comes as if in response to imprecation or as retribution...
- 5: a cause of great harm or misfortune : TORMENT

transitive verb

transgression

: an act, process, or instance of transgressing: such as

uncleanly

: morally or physically unclean

guilt

1: the fact of having committed a breach of conduct especially violating law and involving a penalty

2a: the state of one who has committed an offense especially consciously

b: feelings of deserving blame especially for imagined offenses or from a sense of inadequacy : SELF-REPROACH

3: a feeling of deserving blame for offenses

evil

wickedness

1: morally very bad : EVIL

2a: FIERCE, VICIOUS

b: disposed to or marked by mischief : ROGUSH

3a: disgustingly unpleasant : VILE

b: causing or likely to cause harm, distress, or trouble

4: going beyond reasonable or predictable limits : of exceptional quality or degree

lawless

1: not regulated by or based on law

2a: not restrained or controlled by law : UNRULY

b: ILLEGAL

unrighteous

1: not righteous : SINFUL, WICKED

2: UNJUST, UNMERITED

rebellion

1: opposition to one in authority or dominance

2a: open, armed, and usually unsuccessful defiance of or resistance to an established government

b: an instance of such defiance or resistance
